

EBU LEGAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

The European Broadcasting Union is seeking candidates for its EBU Legal Research Fellowship (funded).

The EBU is the largest organisation of national broadcasters in the world, with 73 members in 56 countries. It is a not-for-profit professional association, serving the collective interests of broadcasters in the EU and beyond. In addition, the EBU operates Eurovision, the media industry's premier distributor and producer of top quality live sport and news, as well as entertainment, culture and music content.

The EBU Legal Research Fellowship (which is funded) offers an outstanding postgraduate researcher (Ph.D or postdoctoral level) in the broadcasting/media law field the opportunity to join the EBU Legal Department for a period of 4-6 months. The Legal Department is a centre of excellence for EU copyright law and media law, comprising eleven lawyers, all specialists in their specific area of expertise, ranging from competition law, IP law, media law and sports law. The Department provides its Members with expert legal advice on all aspects of their business, works closely with EU institutions on drafting and assessing key legislation and also acts as an indispensable forum for Members to compare and exchange their experience.

Naturally, many of our members have highly developed legal expertise in the broadcasting field. However, by being at the heart of Public Service Media in Europe, the EBU Legal Department has a unique pan-European overview of the changing media landscape. It is a fast moving and dynamic environment.

During his/her tenure, the Fellow will be fully involved in the day-to-day work of the Department, including advising Members, leading workshops, and managing specific projects based on current EBU priorities. We anticipate that the Fellow will able to contribute to our learning and, at the same time, learn from us.

Applications are invited from post doctorate researchers and PhD researchers who have already demonstrated achievement and enthusiasm in our core legal areas in the broadcasting/media sector.
